At the **Imagination learning station**, students work on their reading comprehension skills. Using various texts students will demonstrate their ability to find the central idea, argument, or information in a text, provide accurate summaries without adding their personal opinions, use context clues to determine the meanings of words, as well as identify an authors point of view and explain how they came to understand that APOV.
