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Syllabus 8th Grade United States History and Social Studies

I. Purpose:

II. Course Aims and Outcomes:

A. GOALS

This United States history course is designed to

- prepare students for high school history courses, especially toward readiness in Advanced Placement (AP) classes.
- prepare students for the SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) taken before entering university
- engage students to participate in the economic, social, and political events of the day
- educate students about their individual and civil rights, and teach them how to inform others of those rights
- build each student's global communication skills

B. LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, students will have acquired:

- effective study skills, critical thinking habits of mind, and the abilities to read, think, and write like a historian
- the ability to reflect on academic performance and change behaviors in order to improve or to seek help
- to use instructional rubrics to self-monitor and self-assess their learning
- a social science and academic vocabulary that they can use to understand the world around them
- an in-depth knowledge of American history, as well as the ability to ask guestions and to evaluate information.
- the ability to read, write, listen, and conduct research at the 8th grade level and beyond.

C. CLASS FORMAT AND EXPECTATIONS

Main Format:

- O Discovery Techbook is an online textbooks. All students login using their school email.
- Assignments and resource links are given to students through a <u>Digital Agenda</u> and the <u>Google</u> <u>Classroom</u>
- Students MUST place ALL assignments in their <u>Student Portfolio Google Doc</u> to get feedback and grades. There will be one portfolio doc PER semester.
- Students will engage in and be graded on assignments such as, BUT NOT LIMITED TO daily reading and writing, primary and secondary source analysis, current events, lecture, individual and group projects, discussion, debate, research, writing multiple page, formal essays
 (Writing assignments will require prewriting, editing, and drafting, before the final paper is submitted).

- Complete all assignments and follow ALL directions and school rules
- Place your learning and the learning of others above all else.

Course details

This course is based on 8th grade United States history content standards and 6th through 8th grade Common Core Social Science Standards. Our main textbook is online Discovery Techbook, but we also use YouTube videos, current event articles, news sources such as New York Times, Times, the Atlantic, Los Angeles Times, NEWSELA, National Archives, Smithsonian Magazine, and more. A. Late Work & Grading

- 1. If a student is absent, assignments due during their absence can be submitted up to three days late for full credit. The student will lose 10% of overall credit for each day the assignment is late after those three days.
